Answer

The most serious flaws in the Bible? The single most serious flaw in the Bible is how the Bible portrays God. That is the single most serious flaw in the Bible. It portrays God as sometimes loving, sometimes not. Sometimes loving, sometimes punishing. Sometimes loving, sometimes angry. Sometimes wrathful, sometimes wise, sometimes not. Sometimes a megalomaniac, sometimes not. Sometimes narcissistic, sometimes not, and so forth. This is a very damaging view of God and in fact many times it is man's concept of God. People don't understand God's Laws very well and they don't understand God's Principles very well and as a result of that they have a tendency to feel that God is arbitrary in His dealings with people. That's not the case at all but that's what people believe. As a result of that they have a very flawed view or concept of God.

All of the Bible writers, even the writers who associated with me in the first century, had a flawed concept of God, because at times they believed God was punishing, at times believed God was not; at times they believed that God demanded worship or was narcissistic in the sense that God needed everybody to worship him. And sometimes they didn't believe that. They had so many mixed-up concepts of God. One of the things I tried to do through my first century life was correct the mixed-up concepts of God, but unfortunately the mixed-up concepts of God are mixed into the emotional condition of the person's viewpoints of their parents and so if the person is unwilling to work their way through how they see their own parents it's going to be very difficult for them to work their way through getting an accurate and truthful concept of God.

Mary: Okay. You say the most serious flaw in the Bible is the depiction of God. Are there any other serious flaws you can see in the Bible?

I think the second-most serious flaw in the Bible relates to my life and yours in the first century. I feel that's the second-most serious flaw in the Bible because that's the thing that all of the Christians have a tendency to focus upon and then misinterpret. Any flaws that are contained within it are grossly exaggerated and misinterpreted and turned into things that are not true. I feel that the second-most serious flaw is that it does not contain an accurate depiction or record of our life in the first century and therefore does not contain an accurate depiction of what I said. Nor does it contain an accurate depiction of what I did. Nor does it contain an accurate depiction of my life, which included you in my life, and it never contained an accurate depiction of why I died, why all of that actually occurred. There are many other things within the Bible, right from my birth to my death, that are not accurate. Many people then base their faith on my sayings, upon what the Bible says, and unfortunately they also become misled by many of those so-called things that I am meant to have said that I never said. They also mis-read most of the things that I did say and mis-apply most of the things that I said. I feel that's probably the second-most serious flaw that the Bible contains.

There are of course many others. How the Bible treats women, I feel, is a very serious flaw. Women are half of our population. They are for many of us the other half of our soul and yet we are treating them, and the Bible in fact recommends treating them, in a manner that is not equal. There are all sorts of theoretical reasons why Christians come up with that concept, and why they accept that concept. They try to say that God's trying to illustrate that the relationship of God to man is the same as to how a man should treat his woman and things like that.

Mary: Or yourself and the church?

Yeah. My relationship with the so-called Christian church is how a man should treat his wife, and so forth. Very flawed concepts based around interpretation again, based around what they would like to read into it in order to justify how women are being treated. Ladies, if you are Christian, you are not getting treated the way I treated women in the first century. Simple as that. As you know, I treated you in the first century in a manner that nearly every man around us disagreed with and as a result every man who wrote anything in the Bible disagreed with it as well. They often did not even record you in it as well. Now some of the men didn't record you because they tried to protect you but others, ones like Peter and so forth, didn't record you because they didn't like you. Unfortunately all of this error then gets put into a book that people then base their entire lives upon and that's very dangerous.
