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Answer

I feel "What is Divine Truth?" is such an important question to answer. It's the most important question of this series other than the question, "What is Divine Love?" The answer is that Divine Truth is God's Universal Truth. Now that sounds almost religious in its nature but it's not. The reality is that God's Universal Truth is always logical; it is always scientific and always mathematical in its nature. It is always based on the reality, not human reality, not the reality of how we see everything because that's often imaginary rather than reality, but it's the reality of how God sees everything. Divine Truth has a lot of qualities and attributes and through this series we're going to discuss the qualities and attributes of Divine Truth, so rather than me mentioning them now in part of "What is Divine Truth?" let's look at a few of the attributes so that we can understand what it means.

Firstly, one of the attributes of God's Truth is that God's Truth is infinite in its nature. God knows all the truth. Humankind is only ever going to be in this process of discovering truth; we'll keep discovering truth for the rest of our existence and still not find out all the truth. So any book that claims to be the beginning and the end of all of God's Truth is totally illogical, right from the beginning. The Bible itself, claiming to be the end of God's Truth – aside from some comments in Revelation of course; it depends on your interpretation – cannot be logically true because God's Truth cannot be contained in a book. In fact the truth about the human body can't be contained in a book, let alone all of God's Universal Truth being contained within a book.

So we need to understand that Divine Truth is far bigger than most people on this planet and most of humanity imagine. It's even bigger than most people who've passed

over into the spirit world imagine. It's going to be a constantly growing and constantly changing thing, because God's Universe is constantly growing and the dimensional existences in God's Universe are constantly changing. There'll always be this discovery of more and more truth and this is fantastic, because it gives us, humanity, this beautiful desire to discover more and be involved in the process of discovering more, knowing full well that in the end we're not going to be able to discover everything. That's what's going to keep our life very interesting and enjoyable all the way through the rest of our existence.

We need to stop seeing truth as a finite thing that once we've found it out that's all we need to know, because that's not how it's going to be in our discovery of God's Truth. Since God is the maker of the universe, God knows all truth about the universe. We as a finite being that God has created have the capacity to discover truth, but we can't expect to know all the truth. God's Truth isn't contained within a man-written book; it's not contained within any individual actually; it has to be something that individuals discover.

And so what you [Mary] and I believe is that Divine Truth is God's Universal Truth, which we have yet to discover fully. In fact, our belief is that we are yet to discover a minute part of that truth, given the fact that we're going to have an infinite existence, and you and I have been existing for only two thousand years, so in terms of that period of time, that tells us that we've found out very little of Divine Truth. When we share Divine Truth with others we're just sharing the things from our personal experience that we have discovered, which we know for certain are God's Universal Truths that can be proven by fact; they are factual. They're not something that is just imaginary or based upon faith alone but rather the reality of experience. They are scientific in nature, are mathematical in nature, logical in nature, but we realise that we have discovered very little of it and this is what we want to share with people. We want to share with people that the discovery of Divine Truth is going to be an everlasting process and we need to understand how to discover Divine Truth in order to discover more and more of it in a more simple manner.

I have discussed before with people in other questions that the way to discover Divine Truth is quite simple, in that we're better off talking to the Creator or finding a method of communication with the Creator in order to discover Truth than we are trying to experiment in order to discover Truth. Most people, when they try to discover truth, experiment; we're trying to do the greatest experiment which is this experiment with God, getting closer and closer to God and therefore discovering the truth that God knows.

Mary: By you saying that others tend to experiment, you mean in the classical scientific method, where people create a hypothesis and test the hypothesis.

Using some kind of experiment, usually some apparatus but also based upon what they have had faith in before. In other words, if we look at different methods of experimenting, basically we've gotten a body of what seems to be evidence and then some new person comes along and he discovers a new way of getting evidence. For example, people in history like Galileo discovered new ways of finding evidence and in

the analysis of the universe he realised that the Sun did not rotate around the Earth as it appeared, but rather the Earth rotated around the Sun. This of course was a major confrontation to the religious viewpoint of the day, and that means that the religious viewpoint was false and it had to change, because there was a discovery of a new scientific fact. Whenever a new scientific fact is discovered, that is God's Truth and therefore whatever we believe eventually has to conform to it.

Mary: Okay, I want to just clarify this point, that you keep saying, "It's scientific in nature." What you're meaning there is that it's scientifically provable, it exists in reality and it's not a matter of conjecture or interpretation?

Yes. Exactly!

Mary: So God's Truth is always like that.

God's Truth is always like that. Just because a human cannot prove it given their current belief system, it doesn't mean it's not provable. For example, once we die, once we pass and become a spirit, we have a lot more of the universe available for our testing abilities, in our experimentation, and as a result a lot of the things we believed when we were on Earth now expand into new beliefs, because we see through our personal experience a whole heap of new things happening.

This is where humans have got to be very careful what they do when it comes to discovering truth. Most people on earth basically don't believe anything they cannot see and I feel this is a very foolish thing to do because there are so many things we cannot see. We cannot see the basic building blocks of atomic structure with our human eyes for example, and yet eventually we get to see them through a process, through the discovery of apparatus whereby we can test these particular things. It's exactly the same with regard to things about the spirit world. Things that we have personally experienced can be proven; you just need the right apparatus, you just need to know all of their the backgrounds.

This is where I feel the majority of people don't understand the truth about God's Truth. Everything is provable. God's always wanting to share everything about the universe with us; it's just whether we're willing to go through the process of being humble to what we don't know.

Mary: Yeah, and I suppose within that, when you're saying things are scientific and mathematical, basically what I glean from that is that everything in God's Truth is governed by a set of logical laws. So even if we don't know it, it still exists and there are processes that we can engage that will involve logic and understanding, a certain set of laws which will lead us to truth.

... and which would lead us to mathematical justification of that particular logic and truth, and scientific justification of that particular logic and truth.

Mary: I suppose a lot of people would say that some things are scientifically proven. People might say it's scientifically proven that you don't have a soul.

That is not the case at all and in fact, I think probably nobody would claim that.

Mary: Probably a bad example, but I suppose what I'm trying to discuss with you is that there are some things on Earth that people believe have been proven to be false.

See, I don't know about that. I feel that there are some people who believe those particular things are proven to be false, but universally there are some things that the whole of the Earth has now accepted as true and very few people accept as false. For example, that the Earth is a sphere is now an accepted truth on the majority of the planet. There are very few people now associated with any type of discovery of anything going on with the planet itself, that believe that the Earth is still flat. There are some people that do still, there is in fact still a Flat Earth Society but they are very, very much on the outer when it comes to scientific evidence.

Generally in the discovery of truth, there's a process and that is, first nobody knows it, then one person knows it, then a few people know it and then eventually the whole scientific community knows it. Then it's taught over generations to the whole world; that's generally the process. Once the whole world knows it, then it's very, very hard to shift it if it is actually wrong. For example, in terms of religious studies, for thousands of years there was this belief that the Earth was flat; the Bible and most Holy Books mention the circle of the Earth but more, there was this religious viewpoint that they wanted everything to revolve around the Earth. And we know that's not the case; the universe doesn't revolve around the Earth at all. The Earth is just a tiny little speck in the universe. We've discovered that through the discovery of apparatus where we can measure those particular things. This is the case with all of God's Truth; we discover more and more ways of finding out the actual truth. Initially there's one person who comes along and says, "This is the truth," and everybody laughs at them. Historically they've been put in jail; historically they've even been murdered for saying something that the general population doesn't agree with. Eventually, the truth will always win. Eventually the whole population accepts those truths, no matter what happened historically.

Mary: So would you say that that's another quality of God's Truth?

Of course. The truth doesn't conform to humankind's ideas or concepts. In fact humans will have to bring their concepts into harmony with all of God's Truth, sooner or later. So yes, that's one of the qualities of Divine Truth. Divine Truth does not compromise with regard to human concepts; it doesn't try to conform itself to the ideas and belief systems of humanity. In fact it's quite opposite to that. God is never going to conform the universe to humanity's concept of it; we need to discover it.

Most scientists understand that. Most scientists who are looking at the universe have a good understanding of this basic principle that we need to go out and discover what's there. Most religious people don't have a good concept of that; most religious people have a very, very fixed idea about what is in the universe and they are very opposed, due to their religious belief systems, to discovering new scientific facts. Often it has been religion that has opposed the discovery of God's Truth, ironically. So there is

religion stating to the world that they are the people who know everything about God's Truth, and yet they have been the very people who have been opposed to the discovery of new scientific truth, which is God's Truth. I find it quite ironic in some ways that often it's religion that has actually been against the discovery of Divine Truth, God's Truth. I find it interesting that when I talk about God's Truth, most scientific people generally have a problem, because most of them do not believe in a God, and yet ironically, I have exactly the same philosophy that they have in terms of the discovery of truth, with one exception and that is, I believe there is a creator who knows all truth. I not only believe, I know for certain through my personal interaction with that creator.

Mary: And you also mentioned earlier that you have a different process in experimenting in that you would go directly to God.

Yes, and then confirm those particular things through my personal experience of course, as a scientist would with regard to the discovery of what you would call physical facts. I do the same with all facts, spiritual, physical, love, emotional, everything, all kinds of facts; they are all a part of God's Truth. There are laws that govern the flow of emotion for example, between one person and another. There are actual physical laws that govern those particular things; they are God's Truths. There are physical laws that govern the physical universe; there are physical laws that govern what we refer to as the spirit world, which is really just other dimensional existences. There's mathematics that defines them, physical laws that govern them. There are the physical laws that govern the unification of the soul. The physical process of two halves of the soul coming together is all governed by universal law, scientific in nature, logical and mathematical in its basis.

All of these things have the underlying premise that God knows reality and in the end we're all going to discover that reality sooner or later. If we spend all of our time discovering that reality by experimentation without God, well that's fine, eventually we'll arrive at some truth. But I'm suggesting that if you do it with God, you'll arrive at the truth much more rapidly and you'll arrive at much greater truths more rapidly as well. But that's the only difference between myself and a person who has a scientific background.

Mary: And finally, would you say that all of Divine Truth is actually loving?

Always. All Divine Truth, all of God's Universe has been created around loving principles. God's Truth is always loving. A lot of people on earth don't believe that of course and that's one difference between personal truth and Divine Truth. But God's Truth is always loving, it's always based on facts, it's always based on logic, but it's always got entwined with it this emotion of love that flows throughout every single law. In fact, once you understand love, you understand the laws far better, as to why they've been created, how they work. In terms of the discovery of new laws, it's much easier to discover new laws once you understand that all of the laws are based around love.
